

GWO Enhanced First Aid (EFA) Course Outline



Prerequisites: The course participant shall have created a personal profile in WINDA and have provided their WINDA ID prior to completing the GWO training.

Course Length: 21 hours. Course length shall vary depending on the number of delegates.

Class Size: The maximum number of delegates that may be trained and tested per instructor shall be twelve (12) in the classroom session and six (6) in the practical session.

Course Objectives: This training is conducted in accordance with the GWO Enhanced First Aid (EFA) Standard and will enable participants to support and care for others working in the industry by possessing the knowledge, skills, and ability of enhanced first aid.

Upon completion of the GWO EFA training, participants will be able to:

- 1) Provide ongoing care to an ill or injured casualty over a short period of time while waiting for professional emergency rescue teams to arrive.
- 2) Take responsibility for administering safe, effective, and immediate lifesaving and enhanced first aid measures in an emergency in a wind turbine generator (WTG) environment
- 3) Act independently in giving assistance in remote areas using advanced emergency equipment and medical teleconsultation.

Successful completion of this course results in the following certificate:

Practical Session:

The Practical training shall verify that the delegate is able to demonstrate the following:

- Managing an incident and providing ongoing care and assessment while waiting for professional help to arrive
- The use of medical teleconsultation and communication media
- Safe approach and initial assessment of the casualty



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- Treatment of a casualty with catastrophic external bleeding
- Treatment and assessment on Airway and Breathing
- Practice CPR on adults, correct use of AED and (advanced) ventilatory equipment
- Practice Disability, Environment/Exposure treatment and assessment
- Perform head-to-toe examination
- Practice Chemical/biological contact assessment and treatment
- Use of splint material, and other immobilization/stabilization materials
- Treatment of a bleed (internal and external), burns, shock bites, stings, bleeds, eye injuries, significant illness, during unusual situation
- Correct management of a casualty in pain
